Notification

The State Government in the Higher Education Department has examined the fee structure for the tuition fee chargeable by the private / self-financing Engineering & Technology Institutes for the academic year 2015-16 as recommended by the Fee Structure Committee dated: 12th June, 2015

After due consideration of all aspects of the matter including the socio-economic condition in the State, the demand-supply situation in the private / self-financing higher education institutes offering Engineering & Technology courses, the number of seats remaining vacant in such institutes, etc., it has been decided to keep the fee structure notified vide this Department's order number: 269-Edn(T)/10M - 04/2004(Part IV) dated:19.06.2014 unchanged.

Hence, the Governor is pleased to fix the tuition - fee for students to be admitted in the under-graduate Engineering, Technology, Pharmacy and Architecture courses in the private self – financing colleges in the State in the manner given below:

For the students admitted in First Year Engineering & Technological Courses in the Academic Year 2015 – 2016:

I Maximum tuition fee will be the following:

First Year (2015 – 2016)	Rs. 75,000/-
Second Year (2016 – 2017)	Rs. 76,000/-
Third Year (2017 – 2018)	Rs. 78,000/-
Fourth Year (2018 – 2019)	Rs. 80,000/-
Fifth Year (2019-2020) (only for B.Arch course)	Rs. 82,000/-

No separate Development Fee can be charged by the Colleges.



II Besides tuition fee as prescribed, Colleges may charge the following fees from the students admitted in the Academic Year 2015 – 2016:

- a) One time Admission Fee of Rs. 5,000/- at the maximum for entire Course period.
- b) Library cum Book – Bank Fee not exceeding Rs. 4,000/- for the entire Course period.
- c) Students' Welfare and Sports and Games Fee not exceeding Rs. 1000/- annually.
- d) A reasonable amount as refundable Caution Money.
- e) Fees charged by the University for Welfare of students and Development.
- f) Other usual University Fees like Registration Fee, Examination Fee etc.

III Colleges which have opted for and implemented the revised tuition fee structure prescribed for the students admitted in 2014-15 will continue to provide half free-ship to 10% of the students admitted in each of the Engineering / Pharmacy / Architecture courses in the academic session 2015-16 during the entire course period, under the present prescribed fee structure, subject to their satisfactory academic performance.

IV Colleges which implement the notified tuition fee structure prescribed for the students to be admitted in 2015-16, will also provide half free-ship to 10% of the students admitted in each of the Engineering / Technology / Pharmacy / Architecture courses in the academic session 2015-16 and during their entire course period, subject to their satisfactory academic performance.

V No capitation fee in any form or kind can be demanded or realized from the students for admission or continuance of study in the Colleges or for any other reason, either directly or indirectly.

VI No College shall demand or charge any other fee of Compulsory nature from the students.

VII Every college will submit a statement to the Director of Technical Education, West Bengal, by October 31, 2015, enumerating the type and amount of fees charged from the students admitted in the college, and the details of Tuition Fee concessions granted to students admitted in the academic session 2015-16.

This Notification is issued in the public interest and in supersession of all previous Memoranda and/or Notifications issued by this Department on this subject.
